This Qualification is an entry-level qualification for those who want to enter the field of Child & Youth Care Work (C&YCW) as a potential career. It builds on practical experience and community-based learning, and equips people for their role as an auxiliary child and youth care worker. As such the Qualification will also be valuable for those who may have been practicing within the field, but without formal recognition. In particular, this Qualification will be useful for:

- Auxiliary child and youth care workers.
- Persons who work in related fields such as social workers, pastoral counselors, where knowledge and skill of C&YCW is an advantage.
